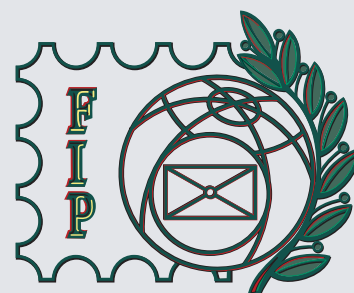

EXHIBITIONS

DUBAI 2026

President Chirakiti who was also Consultant for the exhibition updated that the exhibition was in final stage of the preparation. The Organising Committee would provide the zoom facilities for the FDC seminar. He also went through the agenda of the FIP Board meeting with the Commissions on 7 February to be held in Dubai at 10am.

BOSTON 2026

Director Macedo presented a proposed updated list of International Jury team selected based on the rules and frames submission by the Member Federations for discussion with the Board members.

MACAO 2026

Director Khoory updated that the FIP was now checking the exhibits submission and there were a total of 81 jurors nominated by the Member Federations.

PHILATAIPEI 2026

President Chirakiti reported that official website was now live.

FIP CENTENARY

The Secretary General presented the letter from Fédération Française des Associations Philatéliques on their proposal to celebrate the Centenary of FIP. The Board members approved a maximum grant support of 8,000 USD for their efforts.

FIP SPONSORSHIP

The following official requests from the FIP members had been received the Board approved the 5,000 USD FIP Sponsorship for each of the exhibitions:

201 Years BOLIVIA 2026 Exhibition August 17 to 22, 2026 – by the Federación Filatelica Boliviana

5 NATIONS 2026, 24 to 27 September 2026 – by the Philatelic Society of Malaysia

As the FIP sponsorship for Europe was already given to Serbia for **SRBIJAFILA XVI** which would be held in Belgrade from 7 to 11 October 2026.

The Board still approved a 50% support of 2,500 USD for Europe's second request from Bulgaria for **BALKANFILA XXI-PERNIK 2026, Apr 29 – May 2, 2026**.

BOSTON 2026

Director Macedo reported that the OC had sent out all the invitations to all the jurors in the International Jury team. Unfortunately, four had declined and the proposed replacement jurors were discussed and proposed by the Board.

MACAO 2026

Director Khoory had a zoom meeting with the Organising Committee and President Chirakiti to finalise the accepted exhibits and to work out the International Jury team, which had been circulated to the Board.

PHILATAIPEI 2026

President Chirakiti updated that as at the date of meeting there will be more than 60 countries participating in the exhibition.

SLOVPHILEX 2027

Vice-President Nathaniel updated that nomination of Jurors and appointments of National Commissioners were currently being received and the FEPA Congress shall also be hosted during the exhibition.

PRAGA 2028

Vice-President Nathaniel had signed the agreement for the exhibition in Dubai with the Organising Committee and the official approval shall be requested for during the 78th FIP Congress.

BOSTON 2026

Director Macedo finalised with the Board on the apprentices for the international jury team, as well as the exhibition timetable.

MACAO 2026

President Chirakiti shall make a final site visit on behalf of Director Khoory to finalise the exhibition details and FIP Congress arrangements with the Organising Committee.

SLOVPHILEX 2027

Vice-President Nathaniel updated that the exhibits submission deadline had been extended to April 2026.

IBRA 2028

Director Suhadolc had prepared the final draft agreement and the exhibition would have to be a 6-day event if the 79th FIP Congress was to be held there.

EFIRO 2029

The Board members approved the provisional Patronage for the exhibition and Vice-President Nathaniel would be the FIP Consultant for the exhibition.

GREAT BRITAIN 2030

The Board members approved the provisional Patronage for the exhibition and Director Suhadolc would be the FIP Consultant for the exhibition, should the exhibition wish to host the 80th FIP Congress, it would have to be a 6-day exhibition.

PHILATAIPEI 2026

FIP Consultant Chirakiti reported that 68 countries had nominated Commissioners however not all had sent in the exhibit applications. He hopes the Board members could encourage the continental members to support this last exhibition for 2026.

SLOVPHILEX 2027

Vice-President Nathaniel updated that the Organising Committee was finalizing the contract with the official hotel. The only issue was only 49 countries participating as of now and the submission deadline was supposed to be 16 April 2026. He had asked the OC to extend the deadline.

PRAGA 2028

Vice-President Nathaniel reported that the Organising Committee was preparing the application forms and had already signed the contract with the official hotel to book 150 rooms for the National Commissioner and Jurors.

IBRA 2028

Director Suhadolc had signed the final contract with the German Federation in person during Alpe Adria 2028 in Poreč, Croatia on 11 April 2026.

Director Macedo reported that the exhibition was in the final stages of preparations.

IBRA 2028

Director Suhadolc updated that the website www.ibra2028.com was ready.

FIP COMMISSIONS

CONFERENCE MEETINGS

The Secretary General reported that as the conference meetings for Fight Against Forgeries and Picture Postcards were not called for by the Commissions, the meetings would not be able to be held officially in Macao.

President Chirakiti commented that the Fight Against Forgeries Commission was very important and the expert group in every exhibition were involved in difficult but crucial work for identifying questionable items in the FIP records.

In view of a few queries by the Commissions and new delegates being nominated by Member Federations, the following additional clarifications to the Commissions Guidelines Article 13.3 in blue was discussed and approved by the FIP Board:

REGULATIONS

PROPOSED GREV UPDATES

The Board called for a meeting with the Revenues Commission Bureau attended by Ralph Ebner, Darryl Fuller, Heinz Junge, Károly Szűcs and Jiří Černý (upcoming new Bureau Member) to discuss on the GREV updates.

The Commission wanted to understand motivation of amending the GREV and they expressed that Revenue should be considered as “philatelic”.

Director Suhadolc addressed on behalf of the Board that the rationale was just to make clear postal philatelic and all other classes that have both postal and non-postal use, which, from the Board’s perspective, fiscal was considered non-postal.

The FIP Board proposed another solution which were separate articles 4.3 and 5.3 of the GREV for “Revenues” for their consideration. The Bureau accepted the proposal.

MACAU 2026

President Chirakiti presented on behalf of FIP Consultant Director Khoory that the exhibition was in its final preparations and he reminded that the OC had circulated the instructions on the free internal transfer for any delegates arriving via Hong Kong airport. The hospitality team will welcome the delegates at the Macao Immigrations at HZMB port and at the Macao airport.

FIP CONGRESS

The Board discussed on the details of the flow of the Congress agenda, procedures of the Commissions' Elections, as well as the FIP Centenary Reception. Certificates of Appreciation shall be printed specially for the following immediate past Chairmen who had completed two terms in their respective Commissions and to be presented to them during the Congress:

- Ralph Ebner, Germany (Revenues)

FIP SPONSORSHIP

Vice-President Samamé presented the request for FIP Sponsorship of USD 5,000 by Federación de Entidades Filatelicas de Costa Rica to the Board on an upcoming regional exhibition FILATICA 2027 Exhibition to be held in San José, Costa Rica, from 21-25 September 2027. The Federation had requested for Vice-President Samamé to be the appointed FIP representative. The Board members approved the request unanimously.

MACAU 2026

The Board members commented on the feedback they received from jurors, Commissioners and stakeholders and the hospitality, facilities and arrangements were all very well done considering it was a first FIP exhibition held in Macao.

COMMISSIONS' CONFERENCE MEETINGS

The Secretary General updated on the delegates attending the respective Conference Meetings the following day. Regarding the absence of the nominated Secretary Boštjan Petauer of Maximaphily Commission, in view of his health condition which did not permit him to travel, the Board members agreed that the Commission can proceed with his election, as an exceptional case.

FIP CONGRESS

In view of the last minute feedback received from Members on the proposed Motion by the FIP Board to update the GREV and new proposals within the Board on how to simplify the GREV updates, it was agreed that the Motion shall be withdrawn during the Congress and the Board to work on it again subsequently.

JURY MATTERS

Director Suhadolc reminded that in September, he shall arrange with Lars Engelbrecht a trial zoom training with the Board, which was meant to replace FIP Qualifying Seminars as one of the key criteria for future Jury apprenticeship.

COMMISSIONS

As no Conference Meetings were held for Fight against Forgeries and Picture Postcards Commissions it was approved by the Board that the current respective Board member in charge of each Commission shall be the co-chair of the Working Group and to propose the other co-chairman, secretary and working group members, taking into consideration the original nominations to the election of the Bureau, for the Board's approval as soon as possible.

FIP CENTENARY BOOK

The Secretary General shall arrange for the balance books meant for Members who were not present in Macao to hand to them in PHILATAIPEI 2026. The Board members had received enquiries from some Members and philatelists if the FIP Centenary book could be purchased. The Secretary General shall put up the announcement on the FIP website on the sale of the limited number of balance books for interested parties to get in touch with her.

FIP Medals for Exceptional Jury Service

During DUBAI 2026, FIP awarded the FIP Medal of Appreciation for Exceptional Jury Service to three outstanding FIP jurors.

The first recipient was FIP Past President Mr Bernie Beston from Australia.

Bernie had served in FIP exhibitions as FIP juror for more than 20 times from 1984 to 2022 as accredited FIP juror in the Postal Stationery, Thematic, Maximaphily and Revenue classes. He had also served as Team leader multiple times in FIP exhibitions.

Bernie was in charge of the FIP Jury Academy project since 2018 and this very important initiative has trained most FIP jurors until today to become Jury Fellows. Bernie was also the FIP Consultant for the INDONESIA 2012, New York 2016 and Cape Town 2022 FIP World Stamp Exhibitions.

The second recipient was Javaid Muhammad from UAE, who had served in FIP exhibitions as FIP juror for more than 14 times since 2015 to 2026 as accredited FIP juror in the Postal Stationery, Traditional, Youth and Literature classes. He had also served as Team leader multiple times in FIP exhibitions. He was also the Jury Secretary of the DUBAI 2026 and BOSTON 2026 International Jury team; as well as Chairman of the Literature Commission.

The third recipient was Turgut Turhan from Turkey. Mr Turhan had served in FIP exhibitions as FIP juror for more than 12 times since 2008 to 2024 as accredited FIP juror in the Postal History class. He had also served as Team leader multiple times in FIP exhibitions. Highlights of the 78th FIP Congress & FIP Centenary Celebration held at Venetian Hotel in Macau on 1 July 2026

The 78th FIP Congress was held on the morning of 1 July 2026, at the Venetian Convention Centre, in conjunction with the MACAO 2026 Specialised World Stamp Exhibition.

FIP President Chirakiti invited Vice-Chairman Ms Louisa Ip of MACAO 2026 Organising Committee to say a few words, before welcoming all delegates for attending the Congress. On behalf of the Congress and the FIP Board, he thanked the MACAO 2026 Organising Committee for all their kind arrangements for the Congress.

The roll call was conducted by the Secretary General and there was a total of 48 voting delegates present in person with another 15 votes by proxy. Hence the total number of valid votes was 63.

The Congress approved by show of green cards the minutes of the 77th FIP Congress; the report on the activities of the FIP Board of Directors; the Financial reports and auditor's reports for 2024 and 2025; the appointment of BDO as the external auditor for FIP from 2027-2028, as well as the activities of the 13 FIP Philatelic Commissions.

The newly elected Chairmen for the Commissions on 29 June 2026, were introduced to and confirmed by the Congress. The FIP Certificates of Appreciation were specially presented to Charles Bromser, immediate past Chairman for the Astrophilately Commission and Ralph Ebner, immediate past Chairman for Revenues Commission, for their service for two consecutive terms for their position. As Geoffrey Kellow (Australia), immediate past Chairman for Fight Against Forgeries Commission was not present in Macao, his Certificate of Appreciation was handed over to the Australian Federation.

The positions for FIP President, Vice-President and Director for Asia for years 2026 – 2030 had only one candidate each. All the candidates were elected with the majority of votes:

The FIP Board approved the following proposed GREX change on Article 30.4 during the Conference Board meeting on December 9, 2025 and introduced a Bylaw on the changes made to allow the Exhibition Managements more flexibility in selecting jurors. The 78th Congress ratified and approved the change.

Mr Vladimir Milić announced that due to unforeseen circumstances, the BELGRADE 2027 FIP Specialised World Stamp Exhibition had to be postponed until further request by the Union of Philatelists of Serbia to FIP.

Lars Boettger, President of the Féd. des Sociétés Phil. du G-D de Luxembourg, FSPL expressed that he would like to know about how FIP could support Members more, for example on Youth Philately. Comments were made from Vice-President Nathaniel, Director Suhadolc and the Chairman of the Youth Commission. President Chirakiti added that an article on the success of outreach to the youths in China as a case-study would be published in the upcoming FIP FLASH. He thanked President Boettger for his comments and for kick-starting the discussion on how FIP can work more closely with Members for the future of Philately.

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MACAO 2026 Specialised World Stamp Exhibition 26 June – 1 July 2026



The Macao 2026 Specialized World Stamp Exhibition (referred to as “MACAO 2026”), co-organized by the Macao Post and Telecommunications Bureau (CTT) and the Macau Philatelic Association, officially opened on 26 June 2026 at Cotai Expo Hall A, The Venetian Macao. This six-day event marked a historic milestone as the first large-scale world-level philatelic exhibition ever held in Macao under the FIP Patronage.

MACAO 2026 brought together participants from over 40 countries and regions, showcasing nearly 1,500 exhibit frames of stamp collections, along with approximately 70 philatelic literature displays. The exhibition featured a diverse range of thematic, traditional, postal history, and modern philatelic exhibits, highlighting the artistic, historical, and cultural significance of stamps.

In addition to the competitive and thematic displays, the event hosted a series of engaging activities, including seminars and workshops, fostering greater interaction among collectors and the general public.

By successfully hosting this prestigious global event, Macao has reinforced its role as a vibrant centre for cultural tourism and international exchange, while promoting the enduring heritage and educational value of philately within the community.

The opening ceremony was officiated by principal guests including Representative of the Chief Executive of the Macao Special Administrative Region, Mr. Tam Vai Man, Secretary for Transport and Public Works; Mr. Zhao Chongjiu, Director General of the State Post Bureau of the People's Republic of China; Mr. Liu Aili, Chairman of China Post Group Co., Ltd.; Mr. Liu Decheng, Director-General of the Economic Affairs Department of the Liaison Office of the Central People's Government in the Macao SAR and Mr. Fu Aimin, Director of the Office of the Commissioner of the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the People's Republic of China in the Macao SAR.

The six-day event was also divided into six themed days: Stamp Day, Postcard Day, Art Day, Youth Day, Collection Day and FIP Centenary Day; and featured exclusive activities such as special postmark services. The exhibition attracted more than 10,000 visitors, a remarkable turnout for Macao's first world stamp exhibition.

In addition, MACAO 2026 featured over 40 domestic and international sales booths, creating a vibrant global philatelic marketplace that catered to collectors of all. Most of the booth holders offered a curated selection of stamps, first-day covers, postcards, philatelic literature, and limited-edition souvenirs, with many vendors launching exclusive products for the exhibition.

As a FIP Specialized World Stamp Exhibition, MACAO 2026 featured a rigorous judging process overseen by an international panel of accredited FIP judges. The competition included 297 exhibits nearly 1,500 frames competitive exhibits and 70 literature exhibits across 10 categories: Traditional Philately, Postal History, Postal Stationery, Thematic Philately, Revenue, Modern Philately, Picture Postcards, Youth Philately, Philatelic Literature, and Promotional Class.

The presentation of awards took place during the Palmarès Night of MACAO 2026 which was held on the evening of 30 June 2026. The prestigious grand prizes were awarded to Dr. Yau Khai Weng of Singapore, who won the Grand Prix International for “Queensland Classics”, and Mr. Ding Jinsong of China, who won the Grand Prix National for “Postal History of Mongolia (1854-1921)”.

ACPF organized Suzhou 2026, 3rd All-China Shengxiao Philatelic Exhibition at the Wu Culture Museum in Suzhou, Jiangsu Province, on 5–7 January, showcasing the rapid development and achievements of Shengxiao (Chinese Zodiac) philately in China in recent years. On the opening day, a set of Year-of-the-Horse special stamps and a commemorative postcard were issued, and the Wu Culture Museum themed post office was unveiled.

Report by All-China Philatelic Federation

Youth Philately in China: From Classrooms to Exhibitions

Faced with the gradual fading of stamps from daily life, we all share the same question: when children no longer see stamps, how would philately continue? The All-China Philatelic Federation has developed practical, sustainable ways to engage younger generations—transforming this traditional hobby into an accessible pathway for young people to acquire knowledge and explore the world.

1. System-Led Programs

Lasting programs need both structure-based systems and support from people with genuine interest. All 31 provincial associations of the ACPF have youth philately committees whose members work directly with local schools. In Zhejiang, for example, younger members have explored ways to attract students through social media and other platforms. Provincial youth philately committees operate in two main modes.

First, local committees collaborate with schools to establish regular programs. From 2003 to 2018, 387 schools nationwide became role models through sustained programs in cooperation with those committees. In Shanghai, 78 schools feature stamp collecting, and 32 of them have youth post offices on campus. Students simulate real post office operations, gaining an overall understanding of postal services and stamps while building real-world competence. In many schools, one-page philatelic exhibitions are held on a regular basis, with part of the philatelic materials provided by the schools.

Second, taking philately outside the classroom, as in the “Travel with Stamps” program in Hunan Province, which sends students to actual places depicted on stamps. The stamp becomes a starting point for exploring geography, history, and the world beyond school.

2. Instructor Development & Learning Materials Innovation

The key to sustainable youth philately also lies in qualified instructors and engaging learning materials.

Today, more than 500 philatelic instructors work in schools nationwide, most of whom are classroom teachers from various subjects. ACPF has organized three national training sessions for these instructors to share best practices, exchange experience and explore new teaching approaches. Philately is integrated across learning areas: stamps featuring role models help students develop positive values, while stamps of different topics teach history, culture, science and other knowledge. Instructors also coach students hands-on in stamp collecting and exhibit making, organize campus philately activities, and share their own personal collections to inspire students.

In 2014, ACPF organized an online competition for youth philatelic learning materials. A total of 24 provincial philatelic associations submitted 115 materials, greatly improving the quality and innovation of youth philately education.

Our learning materials consist of three series tailored for young learners:

Foundation series: introduces basic stamp knowledge and collecting practice.

Thematic series: links stamps to history, science, culture, nature, and knowledge on other areas.

Practical series: guides students in hands-on exhibit making.

To attract the younger generation growing up in the digital era, we have integrated digital and interactive tools including short videos, animations, interactive games and AR technology, making stamp collecting fun, interactive and immersive. Our goal is to transform philately from a traditional hobby into an engaging cultural exploration for young people by combining physical stamps with digital resources.

3. Through Exhibitions

ACPF has organized national youth philatelic exhibitions in 1987, 2001 and 2023, all judged in accordance with FIP regulations. Through participation, young collectors have refined their exhibits, and many have continued their collecting pursuits into adulthood. Going forward, we plan to hold a national youth philatelic exhibition every three years to establish a stable and progressive platform for young collectors.

We also ensure the number of youth class exhibits in full-class national philatelic exhibitions. We started a pilot program providing on-site guidance and hands-on training for young collectors at the 3rd Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Greater Bay Area Philatelic Exhibition in 2025, around 60 students received comprehensive support to develop their own philatelic exhibits.

Under the step-by-step guidance of FIP and ACPF accredited jurors, they gained practical experience in theme selection, page design and story telling. Stamps and other philatelic materials were donated by collectors, while necessary tools and supplies were provided by ACPF.

4. Cross-Sector Cooperation

External resource integration operates mainly through two channels: the professional background of philatelists and partnerships with governments and other departments, transforming youth stamp collecting from an isolated classroom activity into a community-supported undertaking.

In Jiangyin, traffic police officer Zhang Ye from Police Philatelic Association, accredited ACPF juror, runs a studio combining road safety education with philately, conducting 60+ summer camps annually. Students use driving simulators to build traffic awareness while discovering stamp collecting through police and safety-themed philatelic materials.

In Gaoyou Experimental Primary School, Jiangsu Province, programs have earned local government backing by showing how philately supports mainstream education priorities: virtue-themed stamps for character-building, and stamp design activities for creativity cultivation. These are delivered through cooperation with China Philatelists Museum.

During his visit to youth philately programs at Changshu Liantang Central Primary School in Jiangsu Province, Dr. Prakob Chirakiti, President of FIP, joined a Chinese Shengxiao (zodiac)-themed class and participated in a Q&A session with students and teachers. He expressed particular appreciation for the integration of stamps into regular lessons and the one-page exhibits made by students, noting that these approaches worth sharing with other FIP members.

5. Growing Competence Through Philately

We've seen some achievements from youth philately efforts, but our goal is helping students develop, not just collecting stamps. In a 2021 stamp design competition co-hosted by ACPF, China Post and China Soong Ching Ling Foundation, 18,000 students submitted entries and three winning designs were officially issued as postage stamps.

The one-page exhibit program, running since 2017 by ACPF, gives students a platform to study and present diverse themes. These activities build more than collecting interest. Letter-writing builds communication and cross-cultural understanding. Design competitions develop artistic sense and creativity. Exhibit preparation teaches careful handling of items, research, storytelling. This focus on real skills keeps programs sustainable.

FIP Centenary Celebration at PARIS PHILEX 2026

The Fédération Internationale de Philatélie (FIP) is celebrating its centenary!

It was in France, in 1865, that Gustave Herpin, the man who coined the term 'philately', founded the Société Philatélique, the world's first philatelic society. Other societies, founded subsequently in Europe and the United States, began organising exhibitions in major cities such as Vienna (1881), Munich (1884), Amsterdam (1889) and London (1890), showcasing collectors' research and attracting an ever-growing audience. These exhibitions were conceived with an international scope in mind, but their organisation remained national: each host country defined its own entry rules, judging criteria and awards, which led to inconsistencies and, at times, discontent. Soon, exhibitors and judges began to call for a degree of standardisation with rules recognised by all.

As international cooperation already existed between nations for the transport of mail, collectors could certainly do the same, and the idea of an international federation began to circulate. The First World War temporarily put this idea on hold, but once peace returned, collectors saw their hobby as a symbol of reconciliation and a means of rebuilding cultural and personal ties across borders.

By the early 1920s, most major nations had a national philatelic federation or a union of societies, but broader coordination was needed to harmonise exhibition rules, represent philatelic interests within the UPU, and combat the growing problem of counterfeits and speculative stamp issues. The time had come to create an international federation.

Between 1922 and 1925, three preparatory conferences quietly laid the foundations for this federation: in 1922 in Luxembourg, in 1924 in The Hague, and in 1925 in Paris, during the international philatelic exhibition held from 2 to 12 May at the Pavillon de Marsan. The delegates agreed to hold a constituent congress the following year, and by the end of 1925, eleven national federations had deliberated and given their support: Germany, Belgium, Spain, France, Italy, the Netherlands, Poland, the United Kingdom, Switzerland, Czechoslovakia and the United States (as observers).

Finally, on 18 June 1926, at 19 Rue Blanche in Paris, in the premises of the Hôtel des Ingénieurs Civils, representatives from seven countries (Germany, Czech Republic, Austria, Belgium, France represented by Maurice Langlois, the Netherlands and Switzerland) founded the FIP. The objectives set in 1926 remain the same today:

- To promote stamp collecting and philately
- To foster friendly relations and friendship among all peoples
- To establish and maintain close relations with the philatelic sector and postal administrations
- To promote philatelic exhibitions

One of the FIP's irreplaceable roles in promoting philately worldwide is to grant its patronage to World Stamp Exhibitions. Over time, these exhibitions have grown considerably and can now feature up to 4,000 frames of 16 pages. Initially, these exhibitions were organised and funded by local stamp collectors' clubs for their immediate audience; they have since evolved into global events in the form of joint ventures between the host country's postal administration and the national philatelic federation. They are the equivalent of the 'Olympic Games' of philately, and only the awards won at these exhibitions are recognised internationally.

The FIP also sponsors regional exhibitions from Europe, Americas and Asia respectively to support its Members that take the initiative to organise these exhibitions.

Today, the FIP comprises 90 national federations which work together to continue shaping the hobby of philately.

In conjunction with the celebration of the Centenary of FIP, the Fédération Française des Associations Philatéliques, one of the founding Member Federations of FIP, held its National exhibition Paris-Philex 2026 from June 11 to 13, 2026, at the Porte de Versailles exhibition hall in Paris. Mr Philippe Lesage, President of the Fédération, invited the FIP Board to join in the celebration.

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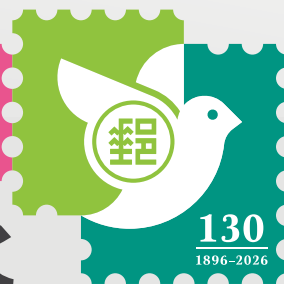


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
